Brown College of Business and Public Administration. He will begin his new position on July 1, 2022 and will hold an academic appointment as a tenured full professor in the Department of Marketing.

Dr. Gómez-Arias brings nearly two decades of experience in higher education. He comes to us from California State University, Stanislaus where he served as dean of the College of Business Administration.
