No additional details are available at this time. My deepest condolences to his spouse, Cynthia Crawford, and his family. Counselling and EAP services are being made available to the campus community. This is a tremendous loss to our university community, compounded by the suddenness and shock.

Sanders, who joined CSUSB in 1991 as an assistant professor in the psychology department, earned tenure in 1995. He was a consummate educator, dedicated to his students, the department and his research. Most recently, he served as the program director of the Undergraduate Research Training Initiative for Student Enhancement (U-RISE), which is aimed at increasing the diversity of students earning their bachelor's degrees and moving on to complete research-focused, biomedical advanced degrees.
